

OUTPATIENT PROGRAMS

Agency to Agency Community Consultation: an outpatient service offered to community agencies providing assessment and/or treatment to children and youth with a variety of concerning behaviours. Your agency can consult with CPRI's clinical team for support, feedback, or further recommendations for a child you are currently working with. Typically this service is offered through video conference however teleconferencing is also available. A referral package unique to this service can be found online at www.cpri.ca

Attachment Consultation and Education Service (ACES): service for children/youth with an attachment disturbance or disorder

Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD): service for children/youth with suspected autism; service for those clients with a confirmed diagnosis of autism with complex behavioural issues

Brake Shop: service for children and youth with a diagnosed or suspected tic disorder and other disinhibition disorders

Dual Diagnosis Program: service for children/youth with intellectual disabilities and severe psychiatric and/or behavioural issues

Home Visiting Program for Infants (HVPI): service for infants who have or are at risk of having a developmental delay

OUTPATIENT PROGRAMS

Homeshare: specialized family placement program for children and youth who have multiple disabilities

Intellectual Disorders and Emotional Disorders: Adaptive Strategies (IDEAS): service for children who are developmentally delayed and have an emotional disorder

Mood Disorders Clinic: service for children/youth and youth who may have been diagnosed with early onset mood disorder

Selective Mutism: service for children and youth who have restricted speech in one or more settings for at least two months

Sexual Behaviours Team: service for children/youth who display sexually intrusive behaviours

INPATIENT TREATMENT

Inpatient Services: are short-term and goal specific, serving children and youth ages birth to 18 with complex mental health and/or developmental disabilities. Inpatient services provide interdisciplinary assessment, consultation and treatment based on the individualized needs and identified goals of children or youth with complex multiple needs.

Referrals for **Inpatient Services** are submitted through your county's Single Point of Access Agency.

REFERRAL INFORMATION

CPRI provides trauma-informed and highly specialized services for children and youth of Ontario who experience complex and long-standing combinations of mental health difficulties and developmental challenges.

CPRI provides services that are based on a partnership model with community service providers in order to develop and promote a consistent and effective plan to assist children/youth in achieving their goals in their home communities.

Before a referral to CPRI is considered, generally, local services available to support a child in their home community are accessed. This may include a local paediatrician, community psychiatry, or a child & youth mental health/developmental agency and/or worker.
